THE CLEAR CREEK INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT is home to explorers and adventurers! Nestled along the NASA Johnson Space Center in Houston and the boating waters of the Gulf of Mexico, Clear Creek ISD proudly serves the educational growth of more than 41,000 students and continues to be one of the most desirable places to raise a family in the Greater Houston area. Clear Creek ISD is the 29th largest school district in Texas, out of 1,031 districts. Our district spans 103 square miles, 13 municipalities, and two counties (Harris and Galveston). We are governed by a high performing Board of Trustees, seven elected community members representing areas of the district. We pride ourselves on involving our stakeholders in making curriculum, finance, and policy decisions, and all of our decisions are made with the best interest of children in mind.

CLEAR BROOK HIGH SCHOOL is a comprehensive high school with an enrollment of 2,257 students. Of this total, 588 are freshmen, 555 are sophomores, 575 are juniors, and 542 are seniors. The student body is composed of students from all parts of the United States and many foreign countries. Our ethnic diversity is 53% Caucasian, 24% Asian, 31% Hispanic, 16% African American, and 8% other ethnicities. Twenty-Six percent of the student body is economically disadvantaged. CBHS rests on the outskirts of Friendswood, a middle to upper-middle class suburban city located five miles from NASA's Johnson Space Center and 3 miles from Ellington Air Field. Major contributors to the local economy are the petrochemical industry, tourism, military, and the many businesses which serve a diverse suburban population.

CCISD CURRICULUM consists of over 300 courses for students to choose from to prepare themselves for a variety of post-secondary opportunities. Courses are offered at both regular and advanced levels. Students may take Dual Credit coursework at San Jacinto Community College South. Advanced Academic, Pre-Advanced Placement, and Advanced Placement course are advanced levels which provide students with more concentrated study in a particular field and receive weighted points on our G.P.A. scale. Classes are taught on a traditional 7 period day and numeric grades are awarded.

CCISD's completion rate is 98.5% and more than 96% of all high school graduates attend college, enroll in the military, or enter the workforce.

Colleges, Universities, Armed Services, and Vocational Programs are encouraged to send representatives to our campus. Appointments may be made by calling 281-284-2268. All representatives must check in with the school receptionist for a visitor's pass. School hours are 7:20 am—2:30 pm.
